Introduction

What is GUILD: GUILD is an Arts Council England Sector Support Organisation run by East Street Arts. The programme aims to support and interrogate the artist-led sector with a primary focus on studio provision in the UK. GUILD works with a cohort of 25 artist-led spaces across England offering training, mentorship, peer to peer support and seed funding. Alongside this work GUILD runs campaigns around artist pay and graduate support to instigate policy reform.

What is GUILD Conversations: GUILD Conversations are a free online workshop programme for the GUILD cohort and general audiences. Originally set up as a response to COVID-19 this programme explored themes of wellbeing, governance and access through a series of interactive sessions, webinars and discussion forums. GUILD Conversations will continue online

and themes.

What are the themes: GUILD will conduct research to investigate Space and Place in relation to artist-led practice and studio provision in the UK. We will invite pioneers working in this field to reflect on their own methods and share skills and ideas on best practices, innovative solutions, sustainability and legacy. We intend to collate knowledge and experience from organisations, studios, artists, policy makers, developers and networks to gain a greater understanding of place impacting on Space.

What is your role: As a commissioned artist you are responsible for creatively evaluating these conversations in order to produce a visual output to share with audiences and institutions.

- ➤ To present an ideology, tool-kit or resource for 'best practice' studio provision in the UK.
