  - Digital engagement
- Turning office into digital hub
- Repainting office, creating a mural to celebrate local people
- Drop in Mon-Fri, 10am-2pm
- In process of becoming a community health hub
- Produce a printed newsletter next edition Feb

# Updates from community - Kezia, MAFWA

- Community arts organisation
- Set up in Lincoln Green in 2018
- Bringing people together who have experience migration
- Two activities weekly
  - Women's drama group food available, creche, opportunity to practise English and build confidence
  - Veg bed growing as a community, starting March
- Over last 18 months to 2 years
  - Redesigning local garden
  - New planting and furniture
  - o Community designed
  - Opening early May
  - Lots of fun things happening in summer need help to shape what you want
  - o Can be part of organising committee

## **Updates from community - Jude, East Street Arts**

- Another project that we're working on about the heritage and history of New Briggate
- May have been on the street to get a bus
- No longer open has been pedestrianised
- East Street Arts working with artists to tell stories of the street
- E.g. before the Grand Theatre was built, there was a horse circus
- E.g. Beatles played on the street
- E.g. jazz history
- Lots of stories
- We can come to community groups to get your ideas, stories, memories
- Lots of activities on the street walking tours, carnival
